Spring Vaccination Visits



After an extremely cold winter, we welcome spring and our shedding horses with open arms! Spring is very busy here at HHVS and appointments fill up fast. **Be sure to plan ahead if you have showing or traveling deadlines.** Contact us today to get your horses on the schedule!

Horses that are traveling or showing or are exposed to new horses on a regular basis are due for their full series of shots including: Rabies, Flu/Rhino, EWT/WN, Strangles, and in some cases Potomac. Most clients also have a Coggins test and a fecal test done at this time. We highly recommend dividing your spring vaccinations into 2 or 3 visits with 2 to 3 weeks in between each visit to reduce the risk of adverse reactions. Remember, there is no farm call charge if 8 or more horses are receiving spring vaccinations at the same farm!

If you are not sure what your animals are due for, please feel free to contact us.
